Benaree (Bennie) Pratt Wiley, MBA

Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*

Principal, The Wiley Group

Bennie Wiley is the Principal of The Wiley Group and was, for 15 years, the President and Chief Executive Officer of The Partnership, Inc. She is an esteemed and sought-after leader, author and speaker on diversity and race relations in America.

Wiley spent her formative years in a segregated Washington, DC One of her earliest memories is celebrating the passage of Brown v. Board of Education with her father. In May 1954, he came home with a bottle of champagne to toast her, then eight years-old, and her 11 year-old sister, because, as he explained, the landmark ruling meant that now they could become anything they wanted to be. That memory has informed and directed the course of Wiley's life.

After taking the reins at The Partnership in 1991, Wiley built it from a tiny, debt-ridden, organization to a powerhouse that elevated the city of Boston's dialogue on diversity. The Partnership's unique mission is to develop professionals of color in Boston, increase their representation in Boston area businesses and institutions. and enhance opportunities for their leadership potential. Through her work at The Partnership, Wiley changed perceptions of race in the city by creating a critical mass of people who understood the importance of attracting, retaining, and developing people of color in Boston. Wiley altered the fabric of Boston and wove it into a tapestry of diverse leaders and ambassadors who were engaged and committed to the city. She continues the work today, energized as she witnesses millennials of different races and ethnicities discuss what they can do to make Boston a better place.

Wiley has been the Principal of The Wiley Group since July 1, 2007, a firm specializing in strategy, talent management, and leadership development. She currently serves as director on boards of the Dreyfus Mutual Funds, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts, and CBIZ (NYSE: CBZ). She has served as the chair of PepsiCo's African American Advisory Board, and formerly served on the board of First Albany (NASDAQ: FACT). Wiley holds a BA from Howard University and an MBA from Harvard Business School. She is also the recipient of Honorary Doctorates from Boston College, New England School of Law and Newbury College. Her honors include induction into the Academy of Distinguished Bostonians, Greater Boston Chamber of Commerce Pinnacle Award for Lifetime Achievement, and Harvard Business School Distinguished Alumni Award from the African American Student Union. She was the subject of a Harvard Business School case, *Bennie Wiley and The Partnership*.

Ethan Pollack, PhD

Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*

Associate Professor, Clinical Psychology Department

Dr Ethan Pollack is an Associate Professor and Core Faculty Member in the Clinical Psychology Program at William James College and is celebrating his 40th year as a teacher at the school. He is a pioneer in the teaching of ethics in the field of psychology and designed the first ethics curriculum at William James, the model for which is still used today.

As one of the earliest teachers at William James College, Pollack's tenure began when the College had only one program—the doctoral program in Clinical Psychology. He expanded his teaching responsibilities as the school grew in size and scope; and in 2008, he closed his private practice to become a full-time faculty member.

From teaching emerging professionals to serving on the boards of professional societies and the Commonwealth, Pollack has worked to further the belief that ethics is a practice in navigating areas of grey rather than a study in black and white. He has pushed for ethics boards to consider ethical violations in their context, understand their genesis and treat the cause, rather than address them in an isolated and punitive manner.

Pollack is also a specialist in clinical work with stepfamilies. He has spent much of his professional life increasing clinical understanding of that unique dynamic and sharing his personal experience as a stepchild and a stepparent. Pollack has directed students in doctoral projects on stepfamilies and has been an influential speaker on the subject to family groups and organizations.

As a faculty member, Pollack has focused on helping students understand the stress and isolation that accompany a career in psychology and the need for a strong support network. He expresses openly his gratitude for the strong family support he has always enjoyed. Pollack is also eager to point out the unique support of the William James family and the flexibility it has afforded him to pursue his own interests over the past four decades. The admiration is mutual; in 2007 he was the recipient of the Excellence in Teaching award from William James.

Pollack currently serves as a member of the American Psychological Association's Board of Director's Standing Hearing Panel and was a partner and founder of Needham Psychotherapy Associates, a private group practice. He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Massachusetts Psychological Association (MPA) from 1998-2001 and served as a member (1990-1996) and Chair of MPA's Ethics Committee (1996-1998).

Reverend Dr Ray Hammond

Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*

Co-Pastor, Bethel AME Church

Reverend Dr Ray Hammond is the co-founder of the Bethel AME Church in Boston and a co-founder and chairman of the Ten Point Coalition, an ecumenical group of Christian clergy and lay leaders mobilizing the Greater Boston community around issues affecting black and Latino youth. He also serves as Executive Director of Bethel's Generation Excel program, an Executive Committee Member of the Black Ministerial Alliance, Chair of the Boston Opportunity Agenda, and a member of the Strategy Team for the Greater Boston Interfaith Organization and the Boston Green Ribbon Commission.

Hammond and his wife, Reverend Dr Gloria White-Hammond, co-founded Bethel AME Church in January 1989, a time when gang violence was sweeping inner cities, including Boston. A seminal moment occurred for the church three years later when Hammond and his church found themselves in the middle of gang violence. As the church's website says, "...in response to the stabbing of a youth at a funeral for another gang member, they co-founded a movement, which Newsweek magazine would later refer to as 'The Boston Miracle.'

His world view that diverse peoples should live together in peace has remained in his central field of vision. On November 4, 2009 Hammond marched on Capitol Hill to protest changes to the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). As a featured speaker he said, "When I say, 'I love this country,' it means I love the people in this country, and especially its children! And I love the fact that their ancestors come from every country and every corner of this world. I love the fact that we're a rainbow of colors and a riot of cultures."

Hammond is the eldest son of a Baptist preacher and schoolteacher. He is a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Medical School and holds a Master of Arts degree in the Study of Religion (Christian and Medical Ethics) from Harvard Graduate School of Arts and Sciences.

He is a trustee of the Yawkey Foundation, the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, the John F Kennedy Library Foundation and the Math and Technology Public Charter High (MATCH) School. He is a former chairman of the Boston Foundation and a published author. Hammond is a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the recipient of numerous honors and honorary doctorates.

Reverend Dr Gloria White-Hammond

Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*

Co-Pastor, Bethel AME Church

Reverend Dr Gloria White-Hammond is the co-pastor of Bethel AME Church in Boston, and the Swartz Resident Practitioner in Ministry Studies at Harvard Divinity School. She is a retired pediatrician who served children at the South End Community Health Center for 27 years, from 1981 to 2007, and is a tireless, passionate humanitarian and social justice advocate.

White-Hammond and her husband, Reverend Dr Ray Hammond, co-founded Bethel AME that has become a powerful change agent for social justice in Boston. The church has initiated twenty groundbreaking programs that serve 2,300 people in greater Boston and more than 4,000 around the world each year.

White-Hammond's humanitarian work has taken her throughout Africa to advocate for women and children who are victims of conflict. From 2001 to 2003, she traveled to South Sudan to participate in an elaborate "underground railroad" to facilitate the freedom of more than 10,000 women and children enslaved in Sudan (North Sudan).

In 2002, she co-founded *My Sister's Keeper* (MSK), a humanitarian and human rights organization that champions social justice for women and girls. MSK has created literacy and peace initiatives to promote peacebuilding among women and across racial divides in Sudan, South Sudan and the Diaspora.

In February 2005, White-Hammond traveled into Darfur, western Sudan, to listen and learn from female victims of genocide in internally displaced persons camps. She served as the National Chairperson of the Million Voices for Darfur campaign, co-founded the Massachusetts Coalition to Save Darfur; and in 2008, became the national Chairwoman of the Save Darfur Coalition.

At Bethel AME Church, White-Hammond is director of the Women's Ministry. One of the many programs she created is "Shatter the Silence", a network of congregations that addresses sexual victimization of women and men in predominantly African American communities.

White-Hammond serves on the board of the Harvard Alumni Association, the Presidential Advisory Committee at Brigham and Women's Hospital, and is a trustee emeritus at Tufts University. She is the recipient of numerous local and national awards for civic engagement.
