

Articulation Agreement

Between

Mount Wachusett Community College

And

William James College

WHEREAS this guaranteed admission articulation agreement is designed to coordinate transfer policies, enhance advising, and promote the acceptance of the programmatic transfer of courses/credits between William James College (WJC) and Mount Wachusett Community College (MWCC) and encourage completion of the Bachelor's Degree.

Given the commitment to diversity, and the mission of the two institutions, it is only fitting that **WJC** and MWCC form a guaranteed admission articulation agreement. Both institutions are regionally accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) with long standing histories in higher education. This agreement will make opportunities for learning accessible to a wider student population in the surrounding communities.

Mount Wachusett Community College Mission Statement:

MWCC is a lifelong learning community dedicated to excellence in education and responsive to the changing needs of the communities we serve. Our focus is the preparation of individuals for lives of fulfillment, leadership, and service in a diverse and global society. We are committed to engaging students in rich and challenging learning opportunities within a small college atmosphere that is known for its personal touch.

William James College Mission Statement:

William James College strives to be a preeminent school of psychology that integrates rigorous academic instruction with extensive field education and close attention to professional development. We assume an ongoing social responsibility to create programs to educate specialists of many disciplines to meet the evolving mental health needs of society.

SUMMARY STATEMENT

This agreement will provide a guaranteed admission arrangement for students from MWCC to obtain a Bachelor's Degree from WJC. Students who have received an associate degree from MWCC Community College, with a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher, will be guaranteed admission in approved programs. Students with a GPA lower than a 2.5 cumulative average are still encouraged to apply, but are not guaranteed admission.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Administrative Matters:

At least one academic administrator or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as liaisons for the implementation of this agreement, to serve as primary contact persons, and to communicate any changes to this agreement to the respective faculty members, advisors, admissions counselors, and others. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Vice President of Academic Affairs (or designee) at WJC and the Provost (or designee) at MWCC. Both parties agree to communicate annually regarding any changes in their respective programs that may affect this agreement.

WJC and MWCC agree to collaborate in the areas of publicity, marketing, recruitment, curriculum, and transfer efforts as follows:

- All announcements, publicity, marketing, and recruitment activities by either
 institution relative to the articulation agreement will be done following a plan
 collaboratively developed and agreed to by both parties.
- Faculty and staff at both institutions will share information in this agreement with interested and qualified students, and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to current and prospective students.

Student Admissions and Enrollment Guidelines:

- MWCC students who graduate with an Associate Degree Human Services and have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 are guaranteed admission into the Bachelor's in Psychology and Human Services at William James College (WJC). Once admitted, students are subject to all other policies and procedures as outlined in the WJC student and program handbook.
- MWCC graduates will be required to complete the required application at WJC, except for the application fee. This fee will be waived by WJC.
- WJC will accept and apply equivalent courses (61-63 credits) from approved associate degree programs. (See Appendix A) Students must complete a minimum of twenty courses (60 credits) for a total of (120) credits where applicable, in order to obtain a Bachelor's degree from WJC. *Students may transfer a maximum of (2), (3) credit courses for a total of (6) credits beyond their (60) credits from an AA or AS degree*. *MWCC students who transfer to WJC with a total of (66) credits, will be required to complete a total of (54) credits in order to obtain their bachelor's degree*.
- Only courses with the grade of D or higher are eligible for transfer. Students with grades of D or lower will receive less transfer credit in this agreement.
- Advanced Placement (AP), College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), MWCC
 Challenge Exams, and Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) credit completed and/or
 accepted by MWCC will be honored at WJC. Students seeking credit for these courses
 must provide WJC with official transcripts and official score sheets from The College
 Board for validation.

Financial Aid / Scholarship Opportunities

Students eligible to attend through this articulation agreement will be eligible to receive financial assistance through the Financial Aid office at WJC. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the WJC New Student Application for Financial Aid to determine scholarship, grant, and loan eligibility.

All applicants are encouraged to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine scholarship, grant, and loan eligibility. All applicants are eligible and are encouraged to apply for a WJC scholarship through the admissions application process.

WJC participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program and the post 9/11 G.I Bill. Veterans utilizing this agreement are encouraged to meet with admissions staff at WJC for more information.

TERMS, AMENDMENTS, AND TERMINATION

This agreement shall continue for a period of **three (3) years.** Additional program approvals may be added to this agreement with the permission of both institutions. This agreement may be renewed with the mutual consent of the parties. This agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason upon written notice to the other with at least ninety days notice prior to the effective date of termination or, if a violation of the agreement occurs, may be terminated upon written notice. This Agreement is not assignable and may not be amended, revised or modified, except in writing executed by all parties. If the agreement is terminated for any reason prior to the end of the effective period, MWCC students who were accepted into or enrolled in the articulated program prior to the termination of this agreement will be able to complete the degree program.
