



### Articulation Agreement Between William James College And

Pierce Mortuary Colleges (PMC): Mid-America College of Funeral Service, Gupton-Jones College of Funeral Service, Dallas Institute of Funeral Service

WHEREAS this guaranteed admission articulation agreement is designed to coordinate transfer policies, enhance advising, and promote the acceptance of the programmatic transfer of courses/credits between William James College (WJC) and Pierce Mortuary Colleges (PMC) and encourage completion of the Bachelor of Science Degree.

Given the commitment to diversity and the mission of the two institutions, it is only fitting that **WJC** and **PMC** form a guaranteed admission articulation agreement. WJC is accredited by the New England Commission for Higher Education (NECHE) and **PMC** is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education, an agency recognized by the United States Office of Education. Both institutions have long-standing histories in higher education. This agreement will make opportunities for learning accessible to a wider student population in the surrounding communities.

#### **William James College Mission Statement**

#### **SUMMARY STATEMENT**

William James College requires all transfer candidates to provide evidence of completing a minimum of 22 general education courses covering the following domains:

Minimum: 4 semester credits (6QH) Natural/Physical Science

Minimum: 3 semester credits (5QH) Humanities/Arts Minimum: 3 semester credits (5QH) Mathematics Minimum: 3 semester credits (5QH) Social Sciences

Minimum: 6 semester credits (10QH) English Composition/Writing

Minimum: 3 semester credits (5QH) Humanities/Social Sciences/Natural or

**Physical Science/or Mathematics** 

This agreement will provide a guaranteed admission arrangement for students from any PMC to obtain a Bachelor of Science Degree from WJC. Students who have completed an associate degree (minimum of 90 quarter hours) from any of the three colleges in the PMC system, with a **2.5 cumulative GPA** or higher, will be guaranteed admission in the Bachelor of Science in Psychology and Human Services program.

Students with 90 quarter hours and a GPA lower than a 2.5 cumulative average are still encouraged to apply but are not guaranteed admission. Financial aid is not available to students until they have earned 90 quarter hours (60 semester credits) at one or more accredited colleges.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### **Administrative Matters**

At least one academic administrator or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as liaisons for the implementation of this agreement, to serve as primary contact persons, and to communicate any changes to this agreement to the respective faculty members, advisors, admissions counselors, and others. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Vice President for Academic Affairs (or designee) at WJC and the Vice President of Education at PMC. Both parties agree to communicate annually regarding any changes in their respective programs that may affect this agreement.

WJC and PMC agree to collaborate in the areas of publicity, marketing, recruitment, curriculum, and transfer efforts as follows:

- All announcements, publicity, marketing, and recruitment activities by either institution relative to the articulation agreement will be done following a plan collaboratively developed and agreed to by both parties.
- Faculty and staff at both institutions will share information in this agreement with interested
  and qualified students, and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to current
  and prospective students.

#### **Student Admissions and Enrollment Guidelines**

PMC students who graduate with an **Associate of Science degree in Funeral Service and** have a **cumulative GPA of at least 2.5** are guaranteed admission into the Bachelor of Science in Psychology and Human Services program at William James College (WJC). Once admitted, students are subject to all other policies and procedures as outlined in the WJC undergraduate student handbook and the program handbook.

PMC graduates will be required to complete the required application form at WJC. There is no application fee, essay requirement, or testing requirement.

WJC will accept and apply general education courses from the PMC accredited associate degree programs toward the 120 credits required for completion of a BSPHS degree (see Appendix A). Students must complete a minimum of twenty courses (60 semester credits) above the initial 90 quarter credits required for an Associate's degree, for a total of 120 semester credits to obtain a Bachelor of Science degree from WJC. A minimum of 30 semester credits (10 courses) must be completed at WJC for students to obtain a degree from WJC.

Course grades below a C will transfer if they are part of the Gen Ed Foundation and students have completed the block with a cumulative grade or quality point average of 2.0 or higher. Credits earned at PMC, outside the General Education Requirements, with a grade of C or better, will be transferred at the discretion of the receiving institution. QH credits will be translated as follows:

2 QH credits = 1 semester credit 3 QH credits = 2 semester credits 5 QH credits = 3 semester credits 90 QH credits = 60 semester credits

Students may additionally transfer a maximum of 12-semester credits (18QH) content equivalent credits beyond their 60-semester credits (90 quarter hours) from an accredited institution, thus only needing 48 semester credits at WJC to graduate. These credits will only be transferred if the student obtained a C or above and has a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above.

Advanced Placement (AP), College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), PMC Challenge Exams, and Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) credit completed and/or accepted by PMC will be honored at WJC. Students seeking credit for these courses must provide WJC with official transcripts and official score sheets from The College Board for validation.

#### **Enrollment and Course Delivery**

The Bachelor of Science in Psychology and Human Services completion program at William James College is traditionally offered as a blended model, with 1 mandatory residency per course, per semester. This program can be completed full-time or part-time, with Fall or Spring start dates.

If 6 or more students enroll as a cohort from PMC, William James College will offer an online-only option. The option will be part-time with no option for a minor. (See Appendix B, Sample Curriculum Map).

#### **Financial Aid and Scholarship Opportunities**

Students with 60 or more semester credits (90+ quarter credits), who are eligible to attend through this articulation agreement will be eligible to receive financial assistance through the Financial Aid Office at WJC. Please note that restrictions may apply to students who are receiving financial support from the Military or Veterans Administration if students enroll in the online-only option. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the WJC New Student Application for Financial Aid to determine scholarship, grant, and loan eligibility.

#### Terms, Amendments, and Termination

This agreement shall continue for a period of three (3) years. Additional program approvals may be added to this agreement with the permission of both institutions. This agreement may be renewed with the mutual consent of the parties. This agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason upon written notice to the other with at least ninety (90) day notice prior to the effective date of termination or, if a violation of the agreement occurs, may be terminated upon written notice. This agreement is not assignable and may not be amended, revised, or modified, except in writing executed by all parties. If the agreement is terminated for any reason prior to the end of the effective period, PMC students who were accepted into or enrolled in the articulated program prior to the termination of this agreement will be able to complete the degree program.
