Our APA-accredited internship consortium is a unique collaboration between William James College and select field sites. The Consortium provides a rewarding educational experience for our Clinical PsyD students and valuable services to Consortium member clients and communities.

What is the Consortium?

The Consortium consists of a group of agencies who have agreed to reserve internship training positions for William James College students.

The Internship Consortium has the unified mission to provide mental health services to diverse populations and to provide psychology interns with a rich exposure to clinical care, a high level of clinical supervision, professional models, and an opportunity to integrate psychological theory and professional practice. Member sites are supportive of the educational goals of William James College.

The Consortium is committed to high quality training in professional psychology and is designed to facilitate the accomplishment of the following nine goals: establishment of appropriate professional relationships; development of psychotherapeutic intervention skills; development of consultation/ education/program development skills; development of psychological testing/diagnostic assessment skills; development of applied research skills; development of professional identity/ethical standards of practice; development of supervision skills; development of effective communication and interpersonal skills and culturally competent work with diverse populations.

How to become member?

To be a member, you must:

- Provide Consortium interns a stipend of \$11,250 per year for half-time or \$22,250 for full-time
- Make a two-year commitment to interns (or 1 year, full-time)
- Attend four yearly meetings with other consortium coordinators
- Support the goals of the Consortium
