## Leadership Conferences for Urban Youth



# CAMHI'S MENTORING PROGRAM

To enhance the academic performance and ensure the successful transition of students who are enrolled in WJC's Bachelor's Completion Program, we provide peer mentoring support to all CAMHI scholarship awardees. The mentoring program is designed specifically to offer professional role modeling, social-emotional support, career guidance and advice that can foster students' entry into the graduate school pipeline.

Throughout the academic year, mentors and mentees maintain ongoing communication and, during their time on campus, are given an opportunity to connect with one another. During the first weekend-in-residence program that was held at William James College in January 2020, Gabrielle Palmer, CAMHI's



Mentorship Coordinator, led a workshop to assist mentors in understanding their roles and responsibilities, clarify expectations, and discuss effective strategies to promote mentor-mentee relationships. Ms. Palmer will continue to serve as the intermediary between the mentors and their mentees as well as coordinate all aspects of the mentoring program, in collaboration with the CAMHI staff.



Ms. Gabrielle Palmer works as a full-time K-12 School Psychologist at South Shore Charter Public School in Norwell, MA. A strong advocate for equitable and culturally responsive education, she does per diem work as a Diversity Consultant with various organizations and school districts. She is currently serving as the Mentorship Coordinator at William James College. Outside of work, she enjoys hiking, playing with her guinea pigs, and reading a good book.

## The Behavioral Health Service Corps (BHSC)



A paid year of service for recent college graduates to explore behavioral health careers.

- Gain hands-on experience and earn while you learn
- Get credit toward your master's degree
- Grow your network and make a difference

#### A Year in the Life of the Behavioral Health Service Corps

- 1. Begin with a 2-week orientation at William James College.
- 2. Receive an employment placement and salary with a partnering agency in a Bachelor's level position and serve in inpatient units, home-based services, residential treatment and recovery centers, among others.
- 3. Earn nine graduate credits through the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Master's program at William James College. Partnering agencies will allow four hours of release time for coursework and professional development.
- 4. Receive clinical supervisory support and mentoring throughout the year-long experience.


## **Bachelor's Completion Program**
